

How to Find a Program Link or Recording on The Cohousing Institute


Step 1: Log into your account at cohousinginstitute.org.



Step 2: Click the avatar at the top right of the screen. (If you have added a profile photo, this will be your profile photo. If not, it will appear as a gray face icon.) Clicking this image will provide a dropdown. From here, click **“Sessions.”**




Step 3: This will take you to your Sessions page. From here you can see a list of all of the programs you have enrolled in. Select the program you are interested in. You can click either **“See more”** or the image. This will bring you to the main page for that program or event.



Step 4: Once you are on the main page for the program or event you are interested in, you can find the recording and/or Zoom link by scrolling down and clicking on the link and/or recording underneath where it says **“Session Content.”** Or you can click **“Start Session.”**

Here is an example of what this will look like for a program that has not taken place yet:



In this workshop, we will explore the multifaceted nature of harm, including the nuances of intent versus impact, evaluating the severity of harm, and recognizing how past experiences shape one's present experience of harm. We will also cover Crystal's unique accountability process grounded in restorative/transformational justice principles which prioritizes repair over punitive practices. You'll leave this workshop with an appreciation for how accountability serves as a cornerstone for growth, understanding, and sustained support in community.

Learning Objectives:

- Understand the complexities of harm, including microaggressions and boundary violations, and learn to address each based on severity.
- Explore how harm is uniquely experienced, considering factors such as identity and past trauma.
- Learn about Crystal's accountability process which promotes effective harm resolution without punitive measures.
